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UPDATE ON A RETURN TO SCHOOL

The Department of Education, on Friday, published the long awaited "Re-opening Schools Guidance - New School Day." We as a school are currently studying and analysing the details of this guidance carefully to consider the implications for our own school setting. There are many considerations we need to factor in before school reopens. I will be writing out to you all, before school ends on 30th June, with a more comprehensive update.

QUESTIONNAIRE

As part of our on-going school improvement, this week, we will be inviting you to complete an online questionnaire on our school web site. The focus will be on Home Learning and Health and Well Being. Your views and opinions will help provide us with an invaluable insight into your experiences over the last few weeks/ months and assist us in planning for addressing teaching and learning when we bring our pupils back to school in September. A link will be sent out to all later this week via the school messaging service.

RETURN OF SCHOOL TEXT BOOKS

Many of you will have school text-books and reading books at home. The school will be open on Tuesday 23rd June from 9-12pm for families to return these books to school. We need all books returned to help us plan for what is available in September. Please come along to the back car park and enter the school via the side door of the school hall.

SCHOOL UNIFORM (Repeat)

As you will be aware we agreed to change our school uniform and school badge for September 2020. This is still the intention, however, it is not compulsory for this incoming year as pupils can still wear their green coloured jumpers, should they still fit. There will be no new green jumpers for sale. New maroon coloured school jumpers will be on sale in August 2020 from the school, further confirmation details on when, where and how to make these purchases will be sent out closer to the time. We hope to keep the price similar to previous years. Trousers will again be grey with a white polo shirt and black shoes.

A uniform grant is available, to those who are eligible but the information on the EA web-site is not updated. Once I have confirmation on eligibility for the 2020/21 school year I will send out the link.
