WORLD BOOK DAY 2024

Our school will be participating in World Book Day on Thursday 7^{TH} March 2024. Classes will be participating in a series of activities around reading and an emphasis will be placed on the many benefits and joys that can be achieved through reading. On this day, pupils can come to school dressed as their favourite book character. We urge parents not to go out and purchase any items specifically for this day. If pupils do not wish to dress as their favourite book character, they can come to school in their own clothes. World Book Day is a Non-Uniform day. A donation is requested of £2 per person or £3 per family, with all monies raised going to the Trocaire Lenten campaign.

TROCAIRE

As we have every year, St Mary's will be fundraising for Trocaire throughout Lent. Trocaire is the Irish word for compassion and for 50 years it has put the compassion of Irish people into action. This year the theme is exploring water justice. We will be learning about Malita and her village from Mandiwasa in Malawi. The effects of the climate crisis is felt the greatest in the global south, even though these countries have done the least to cause this situation. Each class will collect money to help support Trocaire in these campaigns by holding class raffles, there will be other opportunities for donating money through activities such as colouring competition, a bun sale and sponsored skip a thons. We are aware that times are difficult and are grateful for any donation during this time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.


